Students should arrive with their instrument, music stand, 3 ring binder with sheet protectors, and the required method book (refer to recommended instrument & supply list below). Parents are welcome to stay in the lobby or leave during rehearsals, however we ask that you do not remain in the classroom during your child's lesson.

For children 4'10" or under, a 3/4 size acoustic guitar is recommended. This guitar is smaller than a fullsized and thus easier to hold and play. For students 4'11"-5'2", a 7/8 guitar is recommended. Students over 5'2" should be able to play a full-size guitar. Keep in mind, these are just guidelines! If you are unsure, visit a music store to try some out!

****Nylon string guitars are a little easier to start on as they are easier on the fingers. Steel String guitars are the most common but are a tad tougher on the fingers****
